

The Granny Shawl

This pattern is designed to be made in any yarn weight or hook size. A variation of the granny square, this shawl is easy and works up quick. I like to use 2 hook sizes larger than recommended for my yarn to create a less stiff garment. The purpose of the treble crochet at the end of each row is to make the “neck” of the garment more stretchy.

Abbreviations:

chain = ch

sl st = slip stitch

ch2sp/ch1sp = chain 2/1 space, where the 3 double crochet clusters will go

dc = double crochet

trc = treble crochet

the treble crochet is similar to the double crochet, but you will yarn over twice instead of once, then pull through two loops 3 times instead of 2 like you do with the double crochet.

Pattern:

ch 3, sl st in first ch to form a ring.

ROW 1: ch 5, 3 dc into ring, ch 2, 3 dc into ring, ch 2, 1 trc into ring

ROW 2: turn work, ch 5, 3 dc into first ch2sp, ch 1, 3 dc into next ch2sp, ch 2, 3 dc into SAME space, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch2sp, ch 2, 1 trc

ROW 3: turn work, ch 5, 3 dc into first ch2sp, ch 1, *3 dc into next ch1sp, ch1* repeat * to * until you reach the point of the shawl, then work a corner cluster (3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc into same space, ch 1) and continue working * to * until you reach the last ch2sp then, 3 dc, ch 2, 1 trc

REPEAT ROW 3 until you run out of yarn or the shawl is the desired size.

Add fringe for extra granny factor.

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
